WARNING! Breaking in an engine with ceramic-coated headers WILL result in damage to the coating and will VOID all warranties. Ceramic-coated headers require several heat cycles to fully cure before they will withstand extreme heat. HOOKER recommends using a cast-iron exhaust manifold or an old header to break in new engines to avoid coating damage.

BEFORE STARTING

Your vehicle must be raised a minimum of 36 inches. A floor hoist is ideal. If no hoist is available, we strongly urge the use of axle stands as a safety measure.

CAUTION! YOUR CAR SHOULD NOT BE SUPPORTED ON A BUMPER JACK.

INSTALLATION PROCEDURE - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

LEFT SIDE:

- 1. Disconnect battery cable to prevent damage to the electrical system.
- 2. Remove the stock headpipe and exhaust manifold. Remove the dipstick tube and (if stick) clutch linkage. Remove the studs from the head.
- 3. Disconnect and remove the starter. Remove the shift linkage and kickdown linkage.
- 4. Starting from below, work the header up into position. Hold header into position with wire tie. Install the gaskets and bolts.
- 5. Reinstall the dipstick tube and starter. Tighten all bolts evenly.

NOTE: We recommend the use of sealant on the threads of the header bolts.

6. Install the O2 sensor into the header and tighten.

RIGHT SIDE:

- 1. Remove the stock exhaust manifold, spark plugs, and oil filter.
- 2. Remove the studs from the head.
- 3. Starting from below, work the header up into position. Hold header into position with wire tie. Install the gaskets and bolts.
- 4. Tighten all bolts evenly.

NOTE: We recommend the use of sealant on the threads of the header bolts.

- 5. Install the O2 sensor into the header and tighten.
- 6. Connect the battery, start the engine, and check for leaks. Be sure all brake lines, fuel lines, transmission cooler lines, and electrical wires have sufficient clearance. Reroute as necessary.
- 7. When finished, give your vehicle a test drive, checking carefully for any new noises. After several days of driving, retighten all holts
